## School board approves 2016-2017 calendar

School to start August 23



Walla Walla Public Schools Board of Directors unanimously approved the 2016-2017 school year calendar. The first day of school is August 23, 2016 and the last day is June 8, 2017. The approved calendar features a two week winter break, Spring Break the first full week in April and a possible school make-up day May 12. The district had considered starting school the day after Labor Day per perpetual calendar language developed by the 2011 and 2013 Calendar Committees, but this calendar option would have school getting out June 20 which was too late according to

surveys completed this winter.

"The district and the Walla Walla Valley Education Association agreed to a Memorandum of Understanding for the 2016-2017 school year calendar to approve this one-year option and revisit the perpetual calendar language this summer as part of the collective bargaining process," said Chris Gardea, Executive Director of Human Resources. "Our leadership team has an important role of ensuring the calendar meets the needs of our educators and this approval represents the collaborative spirit we have developed in Walla Walla."

#### **STEM Grant request**

The district is applying for a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Pilot Project grant for up to \$4 million from OSPI to help modernize and expand its 53-year-old science classrooms and labs. The current facilities are undersized and outdated. This expansion will allow for increased STEM offerings schoolwide. Community donations exceeding \$100,000 have already been pledged per a grant requirement. A decision from OSPI regarding the district's funding request will be made public in May.

#### **Enrollment/Budget update**

Enrollment remains 150 FTE students above budget projections. Spending is on schedule and the fund balance remains within board target guidelines at \$7.6 million.

Congratulations to Hollis Erickson (Pioneer MS), Jane Eacker (Lincoln HS), Genie Huntemann (Lincoln HS) and Elisabeth Entrena (Edison) for earning their National Board Certification. Currently, there are 44 Walla Walla Public Schools teachers who are nationally certified.

#### 21st Century Program update

21st CCLC Programs Director Brent Cummings updated the school board on the program which operates at Blue Ridge Elementary, Garrison and Pioneer Middle Schools, Lincoln High School and Walla Walla High School for freshmen only. These programs provide academic enrichment opportunities, with a focus on STEM, during non-school hours. Cummings said most of the nearly 700 students participating in the program live in poverty. He said the program is designed to help students improve grades and test scores, build self-esteem, and resiliency.

#### **Preschool Parent Outreach update**

Pam Clayton is the coordinator for a new parent outreach program targeting families with preschool children. She started her new position five weeks ago and is busy planning events. Love and Logic and Ready for Kindergarten are the primary programs she is using. Look for more information in the coming weeks and months.
