

School Board Meeting Recap | November 6, 2018

Bilingual Education Department Program numbers continue to grow

Director of Bilingual Programs Dr. Victor Vergara updated the Board of Directors on district programs during its monthly Study Meeting. Vergara reported the district is taking additional steps to screen English Language Learners (ELL) to determine what programs best meet the needs of these 711 students currently enrolled. Walla Walla Public Schools utilizes English Language Development and Dual Language programs to aquire language skills. A Spanish World Language program was added to Middle Schools last year as another avenue to help students develop second language skills.

Dual Language program enrollment at Edison Elementary is on the rise with kindergarten numbers up. Vergara is carefully studying data to drive program decisions as part of a three year action plan. He said everyone is committed to improvement.

Replacement Bond passing on Election Night

Voter results show strong support for Walla Walla Public Schools

Walla Public Schools' \$65.6 million Replacement Bond is passing with a 70.95% yes vote as of election night. More votes are expected to trickle in over the next few days. The remaining ballots are not expected to change the final outcome. The election will be certified by the Walla Walla County Elections Office Nov. 27 The approval requirement for this bond was a supermajority, 60 percent yes vote.

"Tonight will be remembered as one of the more significant moments in our district's glorious 161-year-old history," said Superintendent Wade Smith. "This vote of confidence further inspires our team of passionate educators and support staff in their collective endeavor to educate, inspire, and engage all of Walla Walla's youth."

Cold and Flu Season Tips

- Wash your hands. Studies show this is the BEST way to prevent the spread of infection.

- Avoid people who are sick! If you are sick, stay home from school or work until fever free for 24 hours.

- Pertussis (whooping cough) is a highly contagious bacterial infection that causes a severe cough.
- Pertussis infections are most dangerous to babies less than one year, pregnant women and those who have not been vaccinated. Unimmunized children could require exclusion from school due to Pertussis.
- Pertussis starts as a mild upper respiratory infection. See your doctor if symptoms occur. Pertussis can be more easily treated if caught early.
