# Levy funding targets programs not funded under basic education model

2019 legislation requires new levy expenditure coding

Last night Superintendent Wade Smith and Director of Fiscal Services Nancy Taylor briefed school board members on progress being made to meet new legislative requirements approved in Olympia in April.

School districts across the state are now required to create budget codes for Enrichment Levy expenditures as another layer of transparency.

Superintendent Smith and Taylor have identified \$16.5M of expenditures not covered by the state's basic education prototypical funding model developed by the legislature to meet the "McCleary Decision" state Supreme Court ruling.

Smith noted programs funded by the Enrichment Levy provide a comprehensive school experience. He reported 12 music staff members, 11 intervention specialists, 13 physical education teachers, 5.6 Advanced Placement teachers and 4.4 safety and security officers are funded

by the levy. Nearly \$1M in levy funds cover athletic coaches contracts. The levy also funds 4 art teachers, 2 Highly Capable teachers, 6 Health Clinicians and nearly 4 Library technicians. The list, developed to capture levy expenditures, also included several maintenance, custodial and technology staff

School board members will continue studying levy needs as they prepare for a February 2020 Enrichment Levy proposal.

### Wa-Hi schematic designs ready for public view

Design work continues on the Walla Walla High School renovation project. Last night Superintendent Wade Smith reviewed schematic designs with school board members. The preliminary design plans are posted on the district's webpage under Bond Updates. Superintendent Smith reported the district will seek bids for the new Science building later this summer with plans to break ground in early October.

Improved learning spaces, efficient operating systems, enhanced access controls and safety updates, improved traffic flow and parking and an expanded Commons were all reviewed during the report. The projects will be completed in stages over a three year period.

### Gossett receives regional leadership award

Last week Superintendent Wade Smith presented the 2019 Southeast Washington Association of School Administrators Community Leadership award to Gene Gossett. Gene was born and raised in Walla Walla Gene served in the US Navy and was detached to Marine Air Operations combat in South Vietnam from 1968-1970.
